REFLECT

Joshua 4:1-3

When all the people had crossed the Jordan, the Lord said to Joshua, "Now choose twelve men, one from each tribe. Tell them, 'Take twelve stones from the very place where the priests are standing in the middle of the Jordan. Carry them out and pile them up at the place where you will camp tonight."

➤ What did you find energising about your day? What felt draining?
> What did you learn about Jesus this year?
How did you help someone else this past year? How did someone help you?
➤ What is something you'd like to improve for next year?
What happened in the news that left you confused, curious, or concerned?
